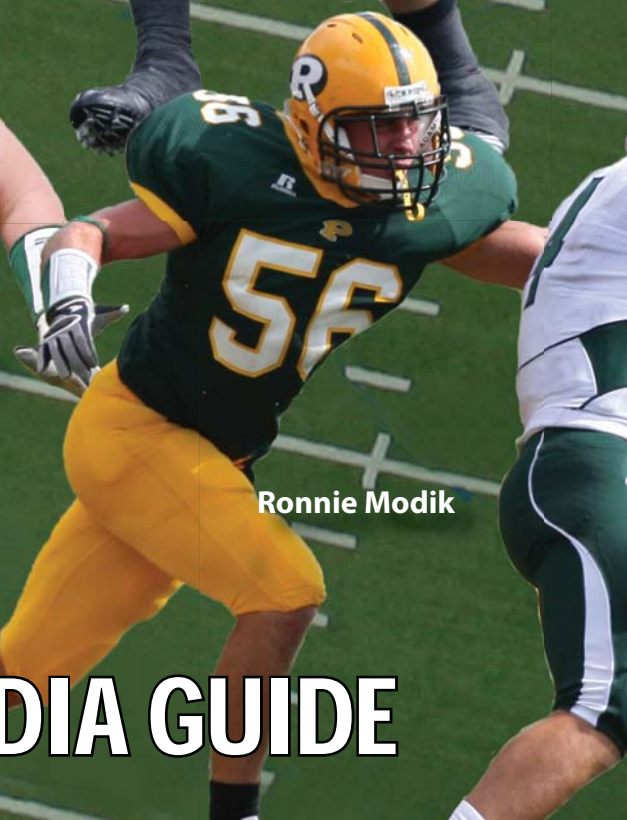

BRYAN COLLINS

Bryan Collins has been the Pioneers' head football coach since 1998, and enters his 14th season as the school's all-time winningest coach with an overall 100-43 record.

Prior to being appointed Director of Athletics, Collins served during the 2005-06 academic year as an assistant director of athletics at C.W. Post. He was instrumental in helping the Brookville, N.Y. school to acquire FieldTurf for Hickox Field, which gives all Pioneers athletics programs the opportunity to practice and play on an all-weather surface virtually year-round.

The 2010 season saw the Pioneers reach new heights in the PSAC as they improved their overall record to 7-4 and posted a 5-2 mark in the East Division that included a triple overtime win over West Chester - the first win against the Golden Rams since 2005. Collins secured his 100th career win in the final game of the season with a 42-38 win against Slippery Rock. Under his guidance, the Pioneers were ranked second in the conference in total offense, averaging 428.7 yards a game and fourth in scoring offense with 33.5 points a game. On the defensive side, junior inside linebacker Billy O'Connor led the entire PSAC with 125 tackles, averaging 11.4 a game.

In just the second season competing in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference in 2009, Collins guided the team to a 6-5 overall record and 5-2 mark in division play in 2009, turning the team around from a 3-8 record a year earlier. In addition, quarterback Erik Anderwkavich was the ECAC Player of the Year and Thomas Beverly was both ECAC and PSAC East Rookie of the Year. Xavier Brown was also named an AFCA All-American.

Under his leadership, the Pioneers have become a perennial nationally-ranked squad that has won three undisputed Northeast-10 Conference championships and a share of another NE-10 title, as well as three times earning a berth

in the NCAA Division II playoffs. The 2005 season was the most successful in the school record books, as the Pioneers won the first two NCAA Division II Championship tournament games in the program's history in advancing to the national quarterfinals. C.W. Post hosted its first NCAA game since 1976, and won a 24-20 decision over visiting West Chester (Pa.) on a game-ending, 96-yard drive. One week later, the Pioneers traveled to top-seeded Shepherd (W. Va.) and beat the sixth-ranked Rams to advance to the quarterfinals. C.W. Post was ranked 22nd nationally at the end of the year by the AFCA, and four players garnered All-America accolades from numerous publications. The Pioneers were named the Division II Team of the Year by the ECAC and CollegeSportsReport.com.

Throughout his coaching career, the backbone of Collins' game plan has been a strong defense, a philosophy that has resulted in C.W. Post defenders leading all Division II teams in fewest rushing yards four times, the most recent coming during the 2004 campaign. Collins-led defenses have also topped the Division II list for defensive pass efficiency in 2003, as well as earning the top spot in total defense twice.

The continued success enjoyed by Collins was noted in the November 2003 issue of American Football Monthly, which noted the 47-year-old mentor's ability to develop a program in a two-page feature article. The publication's Video Series program also acknowledged his talent on the defensive side by featuring him in a trio of instructional videos on the 4-4 defense.

Collins led his 2004 Pioneer squad to its second NCAA berth in three years, becoming the first C.W. Post head football coach to make a return trip to the NCAA postseason. At the conclusion of the season, eight Pioneer players were awarded All-Conference recognition, including six selections to the First Team unit.

In addition to those awards, the team's defense was recognized for the fifth year in a row with the second straight selection of linebacker Joe Gangemi as NE-10 Defensive Player of the Year. Peter Lazare also picked up his second consecutive Defensive Lineman of the Year award from the conference, while tackle Taibika Hickson was tabbed as the NE-10's Offensive Lineman of the Year.

One year earlier, the team finished 9-2, winning their final eight games. Combining a balanced offense with a typically stingy defense, the Pioneers bridged the gap to achieve success in a year that many thought would be dedicated to rebuilding after sustaining major losses from graduation on both sides of the line.

In 2002, the Pioneers reached the Division II NCAA playoffs, competing as the only non-scholarship squad among the 16 competing teams and ending the year with their second straight 11-1 record. His efforts in 2002 resulted in his being named Regional Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association and Coach of the Year by the Northeast-10 Conference.

In addition, the team's rushing defense was ranked as the top unit in Division II for the third consecutive season, while total defense and scoring defense also were statistically established as the best in Division II. The total defense accolade was the second time C.W. Post has won the honor over the past three years.

One indication of the team's defensive prowess in 2002 was the seven games in which Pioneer opponents scored less than 10 points, including four shutouts. Another was the fact that after the first seven games of the campaign, the defense had scored more points than it had allowed.

In 2001, Collins' squad established a new school high in

scoring with 488 points, combining a powerful running game and effective passing attack with a relentless defense that collected an amazing 66 sacks on the year.

That potent 2001 offense had both a quarterback (Frank Ingoglia) and running back (Ian Smart) who collected more than 2,000 yards of total offense. In addition, the Pioneer special teams unit returned two kickoffs and three punts for scores, while also blocking a punt that was converted for six points.

For those efforts, Collins was named 2001 Division II Mid-Major Coach of the Year by Football Gazette magazine, having previously been named twice as Eastern Football Conference Coach of the Year in 1999 and 2000. The latter two awards were in recognition of the team's consecutive Atlantic Division championships.

Following the 2000 campaign in which the Pioneers won their second-consecutive Eastern Football Conference title, all four C.W. Post starting defensive linemen were recognized with postseason hardware, a nod to their standout performances. That accomplishment was acknowledged by American Football Monthly magazine, which tabbed Collins as its Division II Defensive Coordinator of the Year in its September 2001 issue.

The aforementioned running game has been the hallmark of Collins' offense since his arrival. Following a 7-3 mark in his first year, Collins made the team's offensive backfield a top priority. The result was a 1,000-yard rusher (Rick Haering) in 1999, the school's first pair of 1,000-yard rushers in 2000 (Haering and Smart) and the leading rusher in all of college football (Smart) for 2001.

Smart ended his collegiate career as the all-time leader in touchdowns (95) and scoring (570 points) and yards per carry (7.58). He also finished as the #4 rusher in college football history with 6,647 yards, despite being removed from countless games due to lopsided scores in favor of C.W. Post.

Collins has been a part of the Pioneer program for over a decade. He spent five seasons as an assistant coach with the Pioneers, including 1996-97 as the team's defensive coordinator under former C.W. Post tutor Tom Marshall.

A 1987 graduate of St. John's University, Collins played linebacker for the Red Storm. Following graduation, he served for three seasons as an assistant coach at St. Francis Prep, during which time the Little Terriers captured three Catholic League championships.

Collins served as an assistant defensive coach with C.W. Post from 1991-93, helping the Pioneers to the 1993 ECAC IFC Division II Championship, the first postseason win in the history of the program. He then accepted the defensive coordinator position at Kings Point, where he led the Mariners to their first ever NCAA Division III Tournament berth in 1994.

Returning to C.W. Post prior to the 1996 season, Collins spearheaded the Pioneer defense to the ECAC/IFC Division II Championship with a 29-0 win over Bentley. That season, seven of C.W. Post's defensive starters were named to either the ECAC IFC All-Star Team or the Don Hansen's Football Gazette All-Star Team.

The following year, Collins' defensive skills were again on display as opponents managed only 49 points over the final seven games of the 1997 season (7.0 points per game) while the Pioneer defense did not allow a touchdown in three of its last four contests.

Collins currently serves as a member of three committees for the American Football Coaches Association: the Rules Committee, the weekly coaches' polls and All-America selections. In addition, he had an article published in the orga-

nization's 2001 journal titled "When It Counts - Goal Line Defense: We're All There."

In May 2002, Collins authored another article for the publication entitled, "Roll Call at the Ball," imparting his knowledge of defensive tactics.

Off the field, Collins has included community service as a part of his players' responsibilities. Among the efforts since his arrival have been visitations to the St. Mary's Children's Hospital in Bayside, N.Y., while also volunteering with other charitable organizations.

He has also met with and assisted the National Football League in the New York area with its High School Player Development program, which seeks to foster increased interest in the sport along with supplementing the football budgets of schools. He has also worked with the National Football Foundation (New York City chapter) in enhancing its Play It Smart campaign.

Collins and his wife, Patti, reside in Sayville, N.Y. with their son, Tyler (16), and daughter Megan (11).

BRIAN HUGHES

The 2011 season will mark the 14th campaign in which Brian Hughes has served as offensive coordinator at C.W. Post.

The Pioneers enjoyed a breakout season in 2010 and were ranked in the top five in nine offensive categories, including three top rankings in first downs, third down conversion percentage and total offensive plays. They ranked fourth in scoring offense and averaged 33.5 points a game while also averaging 428.7 yards a game. Quarterback Erik Anderwkavich paced the offense, averaging 239.6 passing yards a game. Much of the passing success fell into the hands of Darnel Williams, who averaged 87.5 yards a game. On the ground, C.W. Post carried the ball well with the combination of Thomas Beverly, Anthony Brunetti and Jeffrey Mack averaging 189.1 yards a game.

In 2009, the Pioneers were the top rushing team in the entire PSAC (214.5 yards per game) and fourth overall in total offense (397/gm.). Anderwkavich was the ECAC Player of the Year and Beverly earned Freshman of the Year honors from both the ECAC and PSAC. C.W. Post finished the last five games of the season outscoring its opponents by an average of over 16 points a game.

In 2005, he directed the Pioneers to top-10 national rankings in Division II in total offense (fourth – 517.8/gm.), scoring offense (fifth – 42.5 ppg) and rushing offense (ninth

– 269.9/gm.), helping C.W. Post to its first-ever NCAA Division II Championship quarterfinals appearance. Under Hughes's tutelage, offensive lineman Steven Broecker and quarterback Rob Blount garnered All-America accolades following the record-setting season in which the Pioneers set school records for points (552), rushing yards (3,509), total offense (6,731) and touchdowns (77).

Hughes, the Pioneers' offensive line coach, coached the eventual Northeast-10 Conference Offensive Lineman of the Year – Broecker in 2005, and Taibika Hickson in 2004. Blount was named the NE-10's Most Valuable Player in 2005. During that span, the Pioneers advanced to the NCAA Division II Championship tournament in three of those last four seasons.

In 2005, Hughes was named the Division II Assistant Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association.

In the 1999-02 span, Hughes game-planned his offense around standout running back Ian Smart – one of only four running backs ever to rush for 2,000-plus yards in a season twice, and an athlete who played for the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers and the British Columbia Lions of the Canadian Football League. The Pioneers' trip to the NCAA Championship in the 2002 campaign was the school's first appearance since the 1976 season.

Hughes, who also coached C.W. Post's offensive line from 1993-94, spent the 1995-96 seasons at the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy (Kings Point, N.Y.), where he was the Mariners' linebackers, special teams, and strength and conditioning coach. The Mariners won a pair of ECAC titles during his stay at USMMA.

Hughes, who also serves as Associate Athletic Director for Business Operations at C.W. Post, is a 1988 graduate of Hofstra University, where he earned his bachelor's degree in Geology. He then received a master's degree in earth science in 1994 from C.W. Post – where he has served as an adjunct professor in the Earth and Environmental Sciences Department.

Hughes resides in Bethpage, N.Y. with his wife, Cynthia, and four daughters.





MARK VERDI
OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS
26TH SEASON

As the dean of Pioneer assistants, 26th-year assistant coach Mark Verdi tutors outside linebackers and, as director of football operations, supervises game-day set up. He also helps the program with in-season recruiting.

Under Verdi's guidance, the linebackers have played an important role in the Pioneers' success. Among the many players he has coached include recent Hall of Fame inductee, Brian Hurbert, and current outside linebacker coach Randi Moore.

Prior to his arrival at C.W. Post, Verdi coached for two seasons as both the offensive backfield and linebackers coach at St. John's University. During his time there, one of his top players was Bryan Collins, today the Pioneers' head coach.

Verdi began his coaching career at the high school level in the fall of 1981 as defensive backs coach for his alma mater, Holy Cross High School. He followed that with two years as defensive coordinator at Cardinal Hayes High School.

Verdi is an instructor for earth and environmental sciences at Archbishop Molloy High School in Briarwood, N.Y. He is the proud father of daughter, Taylor Anne (10).



JIM GIBBONS
**DEFENSIVE LINE/
 SPECIAL TEAMS**
15TH SEASON

Jim Gibbons enters his 15th season as special teams coach, and second as defensive line coach – the most recent entries on a resume that also includes coaching Pioneer quarterbacks, tight ends and the offensive line.

Additionally, he serves as C.W. Post's field scheduling coordinator and as the athletic department's community service liaison.

Under his tutelage, the special teams unit has become a potent force, returning punts and touchdowns for scores, blocking kicks and forcing fumbles. In 2009, Gibbons' veteran D-Line recorded 27 sacks and senior Xavier Brown was named AFCA All-America.

At the high school level, Gibbons coached from 1990-94 at Fort Hamilton in Brooklyn, N.Y., where he helped his squads win a pair of Class B New York City Championships. He then moved on to Westhampton Beach before arriving at C.W. Post.

Gibbons resides in Massapequa, N.Y. with his wife, Kerri, and the couple's three children: daughter Brianna (15) and sons Shane (12) and Garrett (10).



ERNIE BLOUNT
DEFENSIVE BACKS
13TH SEASON

Now in his 13th year with the Pioneer coaching staff, Ernie Blount has been in charge of the team's defensive backs for the last eight seasons.

In 2009, the C.W. Post secondary unit ranked first in the PSAC in pass defense efficiency.

During the 2005 campaign, Blount's pass-defense unit played a major role in the Pioneers' overall defense, the best in the Northeast-10 conference and one of the best in all of Division II in 2005. In 2003, the Blount-led Pioneers ranked first nationally in passing defense.

Blount's flexibility as a mentor saw him begin his C.W. Post coaching career with three seasons as a wide receiver coach. Two players who served under his guidance, Eddie Hardaway and Jeremiah Pope, were invited to NFL training camps. This past season, 2007 graduate Jamel Ramsay played for the Preorie Pirates.

In six years of coaching at Baldwin High, Blount helped lead his team to a trio of playoff appearances and also coached in the Nassau County All-Star game.

Blount and his wife, Chavonne, reside in Freeport, and have four children: Ernie, Eric, Elliott and Courtney. He attended Brooklyn College.



JONATHAN GILL
QUARTERBACKS
EIGHTH SEASON

Now in his eighth season as the C.W. Post quarterbacks and wide receivers coach, Jonathan Gill returned to his Long Island roots in 2004 after competing for four seasons at quarterback with the University of Akron Zips.

Gill, who also serves as the team's strength and conditioning coach, was instrumental in helping develop the play of honorable-mention All-America signal-caller, Rob Blount. The 2005 Northeast-10 and ECAC MVP, Blount's 2,995 passing yards during the team's national quarterfinals run are the most in Division II history by a back who totaled 1,000 yards rushing in the same season.

Gill played a key role as a member of Akron's scout offense in the 2001 campaign, and his duties helped aid the Zips' defense in holding opponents to 17 points or less in seven games that year.

The Flushing, N.Y. native was a talented two-sport athlete at St. Francis Prep in Queens. He earned All-City and All-Conference recognition on the gridiron, before competing in the New York City Senior Bowl.



OMAR KING RUNNING BACKS FIFTH SEASON

Omar King begins his fifth season with the Pioneers serves as the team's video coordinator as well as working with the running backs.

In 2009, freshman Thomas Beverly was named ECAC and PSAC East Rookie of the Year after leading the PSAC in overall rushing yards with

1,094 and finished second in rushing yards per game with 99.5.

Prior to C.W. Post, King was a running backs coach at Iona College, where he helped guide Metro Atlantic Conference Player of the Year Dane Samuel, who rushed for 698 yards and four touchdowns in 2006. King also coached former Gael RB Nat Modica to a MAAC Football Offensive Rookie of the Year honor in 2003 while standout Rudy Arcara became just the third player to record a 1,000+ yard rushing season in 2004.

In 2008, King was selected by the NCAA Diversity and Inclusion Committee to participate in its NCAA Football Coaches Academy. The mission of the Academy is to assist ethnic minority football coaches with career advancement through skills enhancement, networking and exposure opportunities while raising awareness regarding the substantial pool of talented ethnic minority coaches.

Prior to Iona, King spent three seasons at Holy Cross H.S. in Flushing, NY, serving as both running backs coach and offensive coordinator.

King was a 1998 graduate of Hofstra University, lettering at running back for two seasons.

He also served as the GED coordinator at the Rikers Island Educational Facility, helping to train and prepare at-risk students for their graduation equivalency diploma. He and his wife, Catherine, and their two children, Dajhanea and Jamar, reside in Central Islip, NY.



RANDI MOORE INSIDE LINEBACKERS FIFTH SEASON

Randi Moore enters his fifth year at C.W. Post and is in his second season coaching the inside linebackers. Moore previously coached the outside linebackers.

Prior to C.W. Post, Moore spent three years at Holy Cross High School, where he spent two years as linebackers and one year as the junior varsity head coach.

Moore is a 2002 graduate of C.W. Post and played outside linebacker for four years and was a three-year starter. He helped lead the Pioneers to a 11-0 regular season record in 2002. Moore received his bachelor's degree in elementary education. He is a special education teacher in Far Rockaway, N.Y. He and his wife, Tia, are the parents of Shayla (6) and Shianne (1).



JOE OSOVET WIDE RECEIVERS SECOND SEASON

Joe Osovet enters his second season at C.W. Post.

Osovet spent the past 15 years as an assistant coach at Nassau Community College and will work with the Pioneer

wide receivers. He worked in a variety of roles while at Nassau, including the serving as the wide receivers before moving up to offensive coordinator.

Osovet was an All-State and All-Long Island player at Babylon High School. Upon graduating, he played two years at Nassau before transferring to Division I Northeastern University, where he played for two more seasons.



DAN MACCARONE VIDEO MANAGER SECOND SEASON

Dan Maccarone enters his second season as a manager with the Pioneers, where he is focused mainly on video processing of practices and game film.

This year, he will be expanding the video capability at C.W. Post with an all-new system for breaking down film and delivering it to coaches and athletes.

Maccarone graduated in 2010 from Hofstra University with a bachelor's degree in Video/TV Production with a minor in computer science - two elements he combines daily in his work for the Pioneers.



THOMAS BEVERLY

C.W. Post has been on an upward climb since playing its first season as a member of the PSAC in 2008. The Pioneers have posted 5-2 records in PSAC East play the last two seasons, and have their sights set on improving upon that mark and winning a PSAC championship as they enter the 2011 season under 14-year Head Coach Bryan Collins.

OFFENSE

Quarterback

The Pioneers look to reload on go-to playmakers and have a hole to fill with the graduation of all-conference signal caller Erik Anderwkavich, but hope to usher in a new era with redshirt freshman **Steven Laurino** (Boise, Idaho.). Laurino, who got a lot of snaps during spring season, has a very strong arm and is one of the fastest players on the team, also making him a running threat. Though he is young, he possesses the maturity to make good decisions on the field.

Freshman **Tyler Heuer** (Oceanside, N.Y.) is also going to battle for snaps at the position. Heuer, who played for former Pioneer QB standout Rob Blount at Oceanside, passed for over 2,100 yards his senior season and completed a record 34 touchdown completions while rushing for an additional 790 yards and nine touchdowns.

Running Back

The running game is one of the biggest strengths this season and is highlighted by the return of sophomores **Anthony Brunetti** (Bayville, N.Y.) and **Jeff Mack** (Bronx, N.Y.) as well as junior **Thomas Beverly** (Wyandanch, N.Y.), the 2009 PSAC

East Rookie of the Year and All-Conference selection.

After adjusting to a one-back system, Brunetti had an outstanding freshman season, where he ran the ball for 589 yards and 10 touchdowns, averaging 5.3 yards a carry.

Mack showed great potential in his first season after coming back from a leg injury. His explosive speed on the gridiron in the second half of the season resulted with 206 yards on 38 carries, scoring his first collegiate touchdown at Cheyney.

Beverly looks to regain his form from his freshman year when he rushed for 1,094 yards and 11 touchdowns. He battled through injuries last season but returns healthy this season.

Wide Receiver

The receiving corps returns all but two this season and will give Laurino a lot of options to throw to down the field. Sophomore **Joe Botti** (Holtsville, N.Y.) and junior **Grayson Laurino** (Boise, Idaho) are two steady performers returning to the offensive line of scrimmage.

Botti had a good experience in his first season and returns as the leading receiver after hauling in 33 passes for 663 yards and six touchdowns. He caught a season-high 10 balls for 227 yards and two touchdowns at Kutztown that included a 71-yard strike from Anderwkavich late in the fourth quarter.

Laurino made the change from quarterback to receiver and was third on the team in receptions with 29 catches for 390 yards and six touchdowns.

The Pioneers will also be looking at **Kyle Hardy** (Matawan,

N.J.) and **Sean Persch** (Gap, Pa.) to step up and take over as deep threats. Both players saw action in all 11 games and each recorded a touchdown pass against Mercyhurst.

Juniors **Ryan Derham** (Lindenhurst, N.Y.) and **Matt Sheehy** (North Brunswick, N.J.) along with redshirt freshman **Chris McGrane** (Lynbrook, N.Y.) will also be counted on to make contributions.

Senior **R.J. Kuhn** (Sayville, N.Y.) stepped away from being a back-up at quarterback last season to move over and earn himself a starting position at tight end.

Offensive Line

A young offensive line will bear the weight this season as only two starters return: seniors **John Siopa** (Centereach, N.Y.) and **Kevin Martin** (Patchogue, N.Y.). Siopa and Martin, who were both named Consensus Draft Services Preseason All-America selections, have been starters throughout their careers and have been recognized as All-Conference in previous years. Siopa moves over from right guard to center and will bring strength and stability to the middle position.

Martin will occupy the left tackle position. Martin is a good player and has gained valuable experience in his three years on the O-line.

Junior **Chris Williams** (Syosset, N.Y.) spent time at the guard and tackle positions last season while junior **Rob Scheuerer** (Farmingdale, N.Y.) moved from the D-line to the O-line. Both should see time as reserve guards.

Sophomore **John Corrigan** (Stockholm, N.J.) had a good spring and continues to get bigger and stronger. Junior **Willie Mayoral** (La Habra, Calif.) transferred in spring of 2011 from East Los Angeles Community College and has built a solid base from the spring season. Redshirt freshman **Mike Calicchio** (Brooklyn, N.Y.) brings great size to the position with his 6-foot-10 frame, and his athleticism will help him earn a starting spot on the O-line.

DEFENSE

Defensive Tackle

The defensive line features four seniors that are solid up front. **Abrom Shepard** (Staten Island, N.Y.) and **Kadeem Huggins** (Corona, N.Y.) are penciled in at the two defensive end positions. **Lou Scala** (Coram, N.Y.) and **Andrew Jackson** (Middletown, N.Y.) return to block the inside line of scrimmage with Scala at tackle and Jackson at nose guard.

The defensive end position will feel the loss of All-American Xavier Brown. Shepard, who is described by Collins as very underrated but a steady performer at his position, returns as a starter this year. He was second behind Brown with 5.5 sacks last season. Huggins has great pass rushing skills and is tall and rangy.

Redshirt freshman **Herb Flores** (East Meadow, N.Y.)

along with incoming freshman **Joseph Thompson** (Cambria Heights, N.Y.), will provide backup for Shepard and Huggins.

Scala and Jackson possess great quickness and will pose matchup problems up front. Scala was third on the team in tackles last season with 73 (26u, 47a) along with two sacks, a forced fumble and a safety. Meanwhile, Jackson was solid on the line with 42 tackles (14u, 28a), including 7.5 for loss as well as three sacks and a fumble recovery.

Freshmen **Golden Ukonu** (North Babylon, N.Y.) and **Derek McMichael** (Bay Shore, N.Y.) can both provide bulk and depth. Both Ukonu, at 6-foot-5 and 364 pounds and McMichael, at 6-foot-2 and 320 pounds, bring size that the Pioneers have been lacking. Also add in freshman **Kevon Foster** (Brooklyn, N.Y.), who was an All-City and All-Borough player at Ft. Hamilton in Brooklyn.

Linebackers

One reason C.W. Post had great success on defense last season was because of its veteran linebackers; seniors **Billy O'Connor** (Sayville, N.Y.) and **Ronnie Modik** (Levittown, N.Y.). Both were also named Consensus Draft Services Preseason All-Americans along with Martin this year.

O'Connor, who had a breakout season last year and led the entire PSAC with 125 tackles (58u, 67a), has seen his time on the field increase over the course of his career and returns as one of the more experienced linebackers in the league. He reads the offense well and has the skills to defend against the run.

Modik also had a breakout year and was second behind O'Connor in total tackles with 104 (39u, 65a). He added five interceptions to his season stat sheet. Modik is a player that makes big plays in the middle.

Sophomores **Rob Bright** (East Meadow, N.Y.) **Maalik McVea** (Freeport, N.Y.) will have reserve roles and provide good, young talent.

Safety

Junior **Sean Smith** (Farmingdale, N.J.) was limited by injuries last season but is ready to resume his role as the starting strong safety. Smith registered 33 tackles (16u, 17a) in 2010 and looks to break out this season.

Behind Smith is sophomore **Chris DiLorio** (Holtsville, N.Y.), who stepped in for Smith and gained valuable experience. DiLorio made 43 stops last season, including a season-high seven in the Pioneers' triple OT win at West Chester, and will battle for time on the left side.

On the right side, redshirt freshmen **Jauvan John** (Brooklyn, N.Y.) and **Kamron Palmer** (Brooklyn, N.Y.) will compete for the starting job.

Sophomores **Tommy Williams** (Westbury, N.Y.) and **Casey Biasi** (Islip, N.Y.) along with freshmen **Devon Levesque** (New London, N.H.) and **Michael Burton** (Patchogue, N.Y.) are a young, talented group that will push for time on the field.

Cornerback

Junior **D.J. Young** (Highland Mills, N.Y.) will hold the left side of the defensive backfield for the Pioneers while junior **Ciwan McCoy** (North Babylon, N.Y.) will fill the right side. Both Young and McCoy got valuable playing time last season and looked solid in matchups against the conference's top receivers.

Special Teams

Freshman **Marc Montana** (East Amherst, N.Y.) will take over full-time placekicking responsibilities and will also handle punting. Junior **Lorenzo Tattoli** (Hasbrouck Heights, N.J.) will remain the long snapper with Modik providing backup.

On the kick returns, Collins has tabbed McCoy as the man for the job. McCoy averaged 24.1 yards per return last season, including an 82-yard return for a touchdown against Millersville. Persch, Mack and Botti will back up McCoy.

Jauvan John is penciled in as the leading punt returner while McCoy and Hardy will also fill in.

Schedule

The PSAC East is arguably one of the toughest divisions in Division II football and C.W. Post will have its work cut out for itself.

The Pioneers open their season at home against long-time NE-10 rival, American International on Sept. 3, and will embark on a two-game swing to western Pennsylvania against

California (Sept. 10) and Mercyhurst (Sept. 17). Both Cal (Pa.) and Mercyhurst were NCAA participants last season and return as the top two schools to beat in the PSAC West. From there, the Pioneers will open conference play in the friendly confines of Hickox Field to host Shippensburg (Sept. 24) and West Chester (Oct. 1).

C.W. Post heads back out on the road at Millersville (Oct. 8) and East Stroudsburg (Oct. 15) and comes back for a rematch at home against Kutztown (Oct. 22), who prevailed with a hard fought 50-48 win against the Pioneers last season.

The squad will play its final road game of the regular season against Bloomsburg on Oct. 29 and will be in search of its first-ever win against the perennially-ranked Huskies.

The Pioneers finish out the regular season at home against Cheyney (Nov. 5) and Slippery Rock (Nov. 12).

GAME 1 Sept. 4, 2010 – Abdow Field C.W. Post 20, American International 11

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. (Sept. 4, 2010) – C.W. Post totaled 464 offensive yards that led to a 20-11 victory in its season opener at American International in non-conference football action Saturday afternoon at Abdow Field.

The Pioneers claimed their first season opener since the 2006 season. It was also their first win over the Yellow Jackets since 2006.

Senior quarterback Erik Anderwkavich led the offense, completing 15 of 22 pass attempts for 191 passing and added 133 yards rushing. Anderwkavich scored the Pioneers' first touchdown of the game on an eight-yard sprint into the end zone and later passed for two TD's in the third and fourth quarter.

Equally impressive was senior wide receiver Darnel Williams, who caught seven passes for 125 yards, including a 24-yard pass from Anderwkavich for a touchdown in the fourth.

AIC totaled 283 offensive yards, including 198 passing yards from senior quarterback Rob Parent, who completed 16 of 31 attempts.

The Yellow Jackets scored first with 14:56 to play in the second quarter when senior Ryan Brooks-Newton kicked a 20-yard field goal through the uprights to lead 3-0.

C.W. Post, who struggled in its earlier drives to score, got on the board in the final minutes of the second on account of Anderwkavich's eight-yard rush. However, senior Paul Stoltz's point after attempt was blocked and returned by senior defensive back Nathaniel Ricks for a defensive PAT which brought the score to 6-5 in favor of the Pioneers.

The Pioneers broke away in the third when Anderwkavich completed a 14-yard pass to redshirt freshman Joe Botti with 4:46 left in the quarter. Stoltz kicked successful PAT to boost the lead to 13-5.

It was a busy fourth quarter for the Pioneers as they recorded 143 offensive yards on 19 plays that saw extensive rushing from Anderwkavich as well as sophomore running back Thomas Beverly and freshman Anthony Brunetti.

The Pioneers' scored their final TD when Anderwkavich found an open Williams and completed a 24-yard pass as part of a five play, 67-yard series that lasted one minute and 56 seconds.

The Yellow Jackets' only score in the second half came with 58 seconds remaining in the game when Parent fired a 26-yard completion to junior wide receiver Andre Samuels.

Junior inside linebacker Billy O'Connor led the C.W. Post defense with 12 tackles, including eight solos. Junior Lou Scala added seven tackles and combined with junior Alex Mauro for a sack. Senior defensive end Xavier Brown added a nine-yard sack in the second quarter.

The bulk of AIC's rushing came from sophomore running back Mike Mayo, who registered 83 yards on the ground.

Senior linebacker Terrence Holley led the Yellow Jacket defense with 12 tackles.

BROOKVILLE, N.Y. (Sept. 11, 2010) – C.W. Post registered two touchdowns in the first quarter but it could not contain California University's offense in a 40-13 loss in the Pioneers' home opener Saturday afternoon on Hickox Field.

C.W. Post came out strong in the first quarter, scoring the first touchdown of the game at 11:37 when sophomore wide receiver Grayson Laurino caught a four-yard pass from senior quarterback Erik Anderwkavich.

The Vulcans evened the score minutes later in the next series when senior quarterback Josh Portis connected to sophomore tight end Blake Williamson for a two-yard shovel pass in the end zone at 8:42.

C.W. Post kept up the game's momentum and added another score in the very next drive when sophomore running back Thomas Beverly bulldozed his way into the end zone from the Vulcans' 2-yard line. The Pioneers, however, could not add onto the score on the point-after after a muffed snap forced holder R.J. Kuhn to pick the ball up and attempt a conversion. Kuhn was pushed out of bounds just short of the end zone.

The lead did not stick for the Pioneers as the Vulcans as Portis completed a 36-yard pass to junior receiver Derrick Jones with 2:57 left to play in the first quarter to put the visitors ahead, 14-13.

C.W. Post gained position on its own 42 after senior defensive back Juma McKenley rushed the return back for 27 yards. But drive ended on 1st-and-10 on the Vulcans' 46 when Anderwkavich's pass attempt was picked off by junior defensive back Shawn Anderson.

In the second quarter, the Vulcans recorded a safety after tackling Laurino in the endzone. They scored on their next two drives, first with an 18-yard touchdown rush from sophomore defensive back Lamont Smith at 8:12 followed by a two yard rush from Portis at 3:29.

The Pioneers made a strong charge down the field with under only seconds on the clock and attempted to get within field goal range as Anderwkavich fired a 21-yard completed pass to sophomore wide receiver Sean Persch at the Cal U. 17-yard line. But time expired on the clock before the kicking team got on the field.

California (Pa.) led 26-13 at the half.

The Pioneers struggled on offense in the third quarter as they fumbled on two straight drives. The Vulcans capitalized on the first fumble when they recovered it on the CWP 47 and eventually scored on a 1-yard run from Lamont at 7:01.

Trailing 40-13 in the fourth quarter, the Pioneers gained possession at 12:45 and quickly started moving the ball down the field. Anderwkavich aired out a 60-yard pass to redshirt freshman receiver Kyle Hardy who caught the pass in the end zone, but the play was called back on a holding penalty against the Pioneers.

Cal U. finished the game with 408 offensive yards, includ-

ing 285 rushing. C.W. Post measured 248 yards with Anderwkavich accounting for 135 on completions.

Beverly completed the game with 74 rushing yards on 17 carries and one TD. Senior receiver Darnel Williams and red-shirt freshman Joe Botti each had 30 reception yards.

BROOKVILLE, N.Y. (Sept. 18, 2010) – The C.W. Post football team amassed 458 yards of offense but it was not enough as Mercyhurst College handed the Pioneers a 28-20 loss in a non-conference contest Saturday afternoon on Hickox Field. Mercyhurst improves to 2-1 overall while C.W. Post slips to 1-2.

The Pioneers took an early 7-0 lead in the first quarter when senior quarterback Erik Anderwkavich found an open Sean Persch for a 32-yard endzone completion.

Mercyhurst found an answer later in the quarter when senior quarterback Garrett Kensy kept the ball and rushed in for a nine-yard score with three seconds left to play in the first.

Mercyhurst responded in its next drive when Anderson took the handoff from Kensy at the C.W. Post 6-yard line and scored his second touchdown of the day on a series that lasted five minutes, 27 seconds.

After kickoff, C.W. Post got the ball at its own 14 after a holding penalty was called and Anderwkavich effectively made completions that brought the ball to the Mercyhurst 12. Redshirt freshman wide receiver Kyle Hardy caught a pass from Anderwkavich on the next play with 1:53 on the game clock for the game's final score.

Mercyhurst completed the game with 393 total offensive yards on 68 plays. Anderson carried the ball 33 times for 237 yards and two touchdowns while teammate Kensy completed 11 of 17 pass attempts with one pickoff for 115 yards and a touchdown.

Anderwkavich completed 17 of 28 pass attempts with four interceptions for 253 yards and two touchdowns and also led the ground attack with 81 rushing yards and a touchdown.

Junior inside linebacker Billy O'Connor made a career-high 16 tackles on defense for the Pioneers.

The Pioneers moved the ball down the field but set up for a 30-yard field goal attempt from senior Paul Stoltz but the kick veered left and narrowly missed the uprights.

Shippensburg endured its own struggles on offense and attempted a 26-yard field goal attempt in the second but senior defensive back Aaron Hall batted the ball down, giving the Pioneers the ball at their own 20.

This time, C.W. Post made good on the opportunity and Anderwkavich found an open Darnel Williams in the endzone for a 21-yard touchdown with 3:06 left to play in the second.

The Raiders answered back in their next series and scored a TD on a 3-yard run from senior halfback Kevin Marshall at 2:29.

But the Pioneers would not go into the half quietly and Beverly took a handoff from Anderwkavich from the 50 and ran it all the way in for their second score of the game.

The fourth quarter belonged to the Pioneers as their possessions occupied more than nine and a half minutes of the quarter. With the ball on the Shippensburg 47 to start the quarter, the visiting team got down to the 15 before Stoltz kicked a successful 32-yard field goal at 12:16.

The Pioneers stole possession from the Raiders with 4:49 left to play when sophomore defensive back Ciwan McCoy intercepted the ball at the CWP16. The Pioneers used eight plays

to move the ball to the Ship 3-yard line and Anderwkavich attempted to find an open receiver before finding an opening and hitting paydirt on his own with 19 seconds left to play.

Williams completed the game with four catches for 87 yards, including a 50-yard completion he caught one-handed in the first quarter.

Junior inside linebacker Billy O'Connor led the Pioneers' defense with nine tackles. Senior defensive end Xavier Brown recorded two sacks for a loss of 14 yards and junior defensive lineman Abrom Shepard registered a sack for seven yards.

WEST CHESTER, Pa. (Oct. 2, 2010) – The C.W. Post football battled West Chester University through four quarters and three overtime frames before triumphing with a 39-37 win Saturday afternoon at Farrell Stadium.

It was the first overtime contest for the Pioneers since the 2007 season when they defeated Bentley 30-27 in two overtimes. It's also the first win against over West Chester in three tries since 2008. C.W. Post captured a 24-20 win over West Chester in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament in 2005.

In the first quarter, the Pioneers' attempt to score in their first drive of the game on fourth down from the WCU 2-yard line was foiled when senior quarterback Erik Anderkwavich was stopped short on fourth down.

C.W. Post came away with a score minutes later after West Chester quarterback Matt Mattei fumbled the ball in the endzone on 3rd-and-8 and junior defensive lineman Lou Scala jumped on the ball for a safety.

The Pioneers' tried for another score in their next drive when senior kicker Paul Stoltz attempted a 37-yard field goal that missed wide left.

West Chester responded in the next drive and marched the ball down the field to the Pioneers' 5-yard line, setting up for 3rd-and-1 where senior running back D'Andre Webb shuffled the ball into the endzone with 2:39 left to play in the quarter.

C.W. Post regained its momentum and scored its first touchdown of the game in its next series at the start of the second quarter when Anderkwavich fired a 16-yard pass to junior tight end Andre Davis for the touchdown.

West Chester got the ball in its next series at its own 28 and marched downfield to the Pioneers' 1-yard line, setting up for 4th-and-goal. Mattei kept the ball and rushed in for the touchdown, giving the Golden Rams a 14-9 lead that stuck through the end of the half.

In the third quarter, C.W. Post started the half at its own 20 and brought the ball down the field to the WCU 4-yard line through a series of completed passes from Anderkwavich and rushing from sophomore running back Thomas Beverly and freshman running back Anthony Brunetti.

On fourth down, Stoltz kicked a 21-yarder through the up-rights before a person foul called against the Golden Rams gave the Pioneers another opportunity to score a touchdown and brought the ball to the 3-yard line. This time, Brunetti took the handoff and hit paydirt for the Pioneers' second touchdown of the game and after an extra point kick from Stoltz, the Pioneers went ahead 16-14 with 11:48 to play in the third.

West Chester came back and scored on a 30-yard field goal from redshirt freshman Shawn Leo at 6:22.

The Pioneers took the lead back in the fourth when Anderkwavich dialed up and connected to Botti for a 14-yard touchdown completion with 10:41 on the clock.

It looked like the Pioneers would hold on for the win when senior defensive end Xavier Brown was closing in on sacking Mattei around the CWP 15, forcing Mattei to throw the ball away into the waiting arms of junior linebacker Ronnie Modik, giving the Pioneers the ball back at their own 8-yard line. But C.W. Post could not move the ball forward and sophomore Grayson Laurino punted the ball away and the Golden Rams recovered it at the CWP 29 with 55 seconds remaining in regulation.

The Golden Rams made quick work on the field and score three plays into the drive when Mattei completed a pass to freshman wide receiver Rondell White to tie game with 15 seconds left to play to force the game into overtime.

In the first overtime, the Pioneers got the ball first and scored when Brunetti broke through the defense for a 1-yard run.

West Chester matched it with a 2-yard run from junior running back Jackson Fagan.

Neither of the teams could score with a fresh set of downs and the game was sent the game went into a third overtime. This time, C.W. Post scored when Brunetti rushed in from the 4-yard line and completed a successful conversion when Anderkwavich completed a pass to Laurino.

West Chester scored in its own drive when White rushed in from five yards out. But the Golden Rams' attempt to complete a conversion and force another overtime failed when Mattei's pass to a waiting receiver in the end zone fell short and hit the ground.

Anderkwavich completed 22 of 37 pass attempts for 260 yards and two touchdowns. Brunetti led the ground attack with 69 rushing yards and a season-high three touchdowns.

On defense, junior inside linebacker Billy O'Connor recorded a game-high 15 tackles (6u,9a) and recovered a fumble. Modik had 14 tackles with a forced fumble and an interception. Junior defensive lineman Lou Scala and junior defensive lineman TuQwan Ashley each recorded a sack in the game.

For West Chester, Mattei finished the game with 30 completions on 45 attempts with one interception and two touchdowns. Fagan was his favorite target, catching 11 passes for 112 yards for two touchdown receptions and added 30 rushing yards with a touchdown. Webb also had 30 yards and a touchdown.

Senior linebacker Morty Hoey led the defense with seven tackles.

BROOKVILLE, N.Y. (Oct. 9, 2010) – C.W. Post scored seven touchdowns to defeat Millersville University, 49-21, in PSAC East football action Saturday afternoon on Hickox Field.

It was the highest scoring output for the Pioneers since their 51-0 win over Cheyney University on Sept. 19, 2009, which was also played on Hickox.

The Pioneers jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the first quarter with touchdown runs from sophomore running back Thomas Beverly and senior quarterback Erik Anderwkavich.

C.W. Post won the coin toss prior to the start of the game and deferred to Millersville. The Marauders picked the ball up at their own 30 after kickoff and moved the ball to the Pioneers' 23 before losing possession on a fourth down sack against quarterback Bill Shirk by junior inside linebacker Ronnie Modik, setting up for Beverly's 3-yard run on second and goal at 8:24.

The Pioneers stole the ball again during the Marauders' second series when senior defensive back Juma McKenley picked off a throw from Shirk at the Pioneers' 25 and returned it 55 yards to the Millersville 20. From there, Anderwkavich completed a 10-yard pass to senior wide receiver Darnel Williams before rushing in on the next play from the 10-yard line.

In the second quarter, C.W. Post scored its third touchdown with 2:55 on the clock when Anderwkavich completed an 18-yard pass to junior tight end Andre Davis. The Pioneers scored again when Modik picked up a Millersville fumble caused by freshman safety Chris DiIorio at the C.W. Post 45 and returned it all the way for a 55-yard touchdown.

At the half, the Pioneers had amassed 251 yards, including 159 rushing.

Millersville got on the board in the third quarter after recovering the ball in C.W. Post's previous series at the C.W. Post 23 and scored on a completed pass from Shirk to Jamal Smith from the 11-yard line.

The Pioneers responded immediately and scored in the next drive when freshman running back Anthony Brunetti rushed in for a one-yard run to boost the Pioneers' lead to 35-14.

The scoring continued for C.W. Post in the fourth quarter as the home team scored two more touchdowns, beginning with a 29-yard pass from Anderwkavich to Williams at the start of the quarter.

The Marauders followed up with a 1-yard run from Shirk to cut C.W. Post's lead to 42-21.

But the Pioneers' lead increased again when sophomore defensive back Ciwan McCoy returned Millersville's kickoff for an 82-yard sprint into the endzone with 9:09 left on the clock.

Anderwkavich completed 13 of 20 pass attempts with one interception for 188 yards and two touchdowns. Williams caught seven passes for 87 yards and one touchdown and Davis hauled in three catches for 42 yards.

Beverly led the game in rushing with 67 yards on 21 carries and one touchdown and Anderwkavich added 60 yards on 12 carries with a touchdown.

Junior inside linebacker Billy O'Connor led the Pioneer defense with nine tackles and senior defensive end Xavier Brown added four solo tackles and two sacks for a loss of 17 yards. Also highlighting the defense was junior defensive lineman Abrom Shepard, who had a 12-yard sack and senior defensive lineman Ryan Contee who had an 8-yard sack.

Shirk finished the day completing 24 of 43 pass attempts with three interceptions for 255 yards and a touchdown.

Fateem led the team in rushing with 47 yards on 14 carries. Jamal Smith finished the game with five catches for 70 yards and a touchdown.

On defense, Gary Tillman led the squad with 10 tackles and Pat Cantrell recorded four tackles and a 4-yard sack.

BROOKVILLE, N.Y. (Oct. 16, 2010) – The C.W. Post football team scored 13 points in the fourth quarter to ice over a 38-17 win against East Stroudsburg University on Homecoming Saturday afternoon on Hickox Field.

Senior quarterback Erik Anderwkavich led the Pioneer offense with 15 of 29 completed attempts for 205 yards and three touchdown completions. He also led the rushing unit with 59 yards on 12 carries.

Junior inside linebacker Ronnie Modik registered a career-high 17 tackles and also recorded a forced fumble, a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry in the game.

East Stroudsburg scored the game's first touchdown at 9:12 in the first quarter when Kendrick Williams hit paydirt on a 22-yard rush to put the Warriors ahead, 7-0.

C.W. Post answered just over three minutes later when senior wide receiver Darnel Williams caught a 19-yard offering from Anderwkavich at 6:10. Freshman kicker Keith Hadnag's point after kick was blocked and the Pioneers trailed by one (7-6).

In the second quarter, C.W. Post took the lead on another Anderwkavich to Williams combo for an 8-yard touchdown. Hadnag's kick went wide but the touchdown gave the Pioneers a 12-7 lead that lasted through the end of the quarter.

East Stroudsburg refused to go away quietly and the Warriors reclaimed the lead (14-12) in the third when Dusty Reed pulled down a 21-yard catch from quarterback Matt Marshall.

The Pioneers came back and scored on a 39-yard field goal from Hadnag with 2:28 to play in the third.

With just a slim 15-14 C.W. Post lead heading into the fourth, both teams got down to business and played hard-nosed football.

The Pioneers struck first when Anderwkavich found junior wide receiver Grayson Laurino open and completed a high pass for a 9-yard touchdown that put them ahead 22-14.

The Warriors started their next drive out on their own 33 and marched down the field to the 20 but could not break the plane and resorted to a 37-yard field goal from Taylor Groff.

The Pioneers punted the ball away in their next series and East Stroudsburg picked the ball up at the 50-yard line.

The Warriors could not gain any ground and lost possession when junior Lou Scala picked off a Marshall pass and returned it to the CWP 38.

But the Pioneers couldn't capitalize and lost possession D'John Tillman intercepted a pass from Anderwkavich at the ESU 32. C.W. Post's defense was heavy on the offense and forced the Warriors to punt away.

The Pioneers iced the game over when freshman defensive back Donovan Edwards scored on a pick 6 after he intercepted the ball at the CWP 32 and returned it all the way with 2:17 to play in the fourth.

C.W. Post registered 351 yards of offense on 70 plays with 18 first downs. East Stroudsburg registered 305 offensive yards on 70 plays with 17 first downs.

Darnel Williams finished the game with six catches for 104 yards and two touchdowns. Senior wide receiver Andrew Kell caught six passes for 44 yards.

GAME 8 Oct. 23, 2010 – University Field Kutztown 50, C.W. Post 48

KUTZTOWN, Pa. (Oct. 23, 2010) – Despite a career night from senior quarterback Erik Anderwkavich, who set both a school and PSAC record with 651 offensive yards (566 passing, 85 rushing), C.W. Post was unable to overcome a second-half deficit against Kutztown University. A failed 30-yard C.W. Post field goal attempt with four seconds on the clock allowed the 18th-ranked Golden Bears to escape with a 50-48 win.

Anderwkavich's total yards surpassed the record set by Edinboro's Trevor Harris, who had 647 against West Liberty in 2009. He also eclipsed former Pioneer standout Perry Klein's mark of 623 yards, including 614 passing, against Salisbury State in 1993.

The Pioneers trailed 47-27 in the fourth quarter after allowing a 21-point gain by Kutztown in the third and another touchdown score by the Golden Bears at the start of the fourth. They nearly caught themselves up with three touchdown completions from Anderwkavich to bring the score to 50-48.

With 2:46 to play in the fourth, the visitors had one more chance to score and got the ball back on their own 20 after the defense forced Kutztown to punt away on fourth down. Anderwkavich completed seven passes for 64 yards and rushed twice for 28 yards to move the ball down to the KU 6, setting up 1st-and-goal with 15.2 seconds on the clock. After a seven-yard sack on Anderwkavich and four seconds left on the clock, the Pioneers opted for a 30-yard field goal attempt by freshman Keith Hadnagy but the kick was wide left as the final seconds expired on the game clock.

Kutztown took a 10-7 lead in the first quarter with a 19-yard field goal from Matt Dineen and a 1-yard touchdown run from quarterback Kevin Morton. The Pioneers scored on a 5-yard pass from Anderwkavich to senior wide receiver Darnel Williams.

In the second quarter, Kutztown pushed its lead to 19-7 with a 35-yard touchdown pass from Kevin Morton to Chris McCormick and a 22-yard field goal from Dineen.

The Pioneers answered back late in the quarter with a pair of touchdown runs from sophomore running back Thomas Beverly to give them a 21-19 lead at halftime.

In the third quarter, the Golden Bears took control of the game and put up three touchdowns that included a 40-yard run from Josh Mastromatt with 5:31 to play in the quarter and boosted their lead to 40-27.

Kutztown scored again at the start of the fourth quarter when Mastromatt rushed in for an 11-yard touchdown run to lead 47-27.

With time not on their side, the Pioneers quickly tried to climb back into the game, beginning with a 24-yard TD pass from Anderwkavich to sophomore wide receiver Grayson Laurino at 13:43 that took only 1:10 off the game clock.

The Golden Bears scored in their next drive with a 38-yard field goal from Dineen to push the lead to 50-34 with 9:52 to play.

C.W. Post got the ball back on their own 27 with 9:41 to play that resulted in a 6-yard touchdown from Anderwkavich to Williams. Anderwkavich found Williams open again and converted the 2-point conversion to slice the Golden Bears' lead to 50-42 and 8:27 to play.

The Pioneers scored one more touchdown in the game when Anderwkavich aired out a long pass to Botti for a 71-yard touchdown with 5:47 on the clock.

C.W. Post completed the game with 708 offensive yards on 86 plays. Kutztown registered 520 offensive yards on 70 plays. The teams combined for a total of 1,228 offensive yards in the

game.

Turnovers hurt the Pioneers as they lost possession twice on fumbles along with a 24-yard interception.

Botti finished the game with 10 catches for 227 yards and two touchdowns while Williams hauled in 11 catches for 131 yards and two touchdowns.

Junior inside linebacker Billy O'Connor led the defense with 10 tackles. Junior nose guard Andrew Jackson registered two sacks for loss of five yards. The Pioneer defense totaled five sacks for 15 yards.

Morton finished the game completing 25 of 35 pass attempts for 354 yards and two touchdowns while rushing in another touchdown. McCormick caught six passes for 125 yards and a touchdown and teammate Erik Frazier caught seven passes for 88 yards.

Four players led the Golden Bears with nine tackles in the game.

BROOKVILLE, N.Y. (Oct. 30, 2010) – Senior quarterback Erik Anderwkavich passed for 209 yards and two touchdowns but it was not enough as C.W. Post fell to 13th-ranked Bloomsburg University, 36-16, in a PSAC East football showdown Saturday afternoon on Hickox Field.

Bloomsburg spotted itself a 10-0 lead through the first quarter when quarterback Pat Carey completed a five-yard pass to Andre Morales at 12:31. The Huskies added another score late in the quarter when Dan Fisher drilled a successful 41-yard field goal attempt through the uprights.

Fisher would lead the Husky offense with a school record five field goals in the game, including two more in the second quarter that put Bloomsburg ahead, 16-0.

C.W. Post got on the board with 4:30 to play in the second when Bloomsburg was called for a holding penalty from its own 3-yard line that resulted in a team safety for the Pioneers. Fisher kicked two more field goals in the third quarter at 10:35 and 7:18 that boosted Bloomsburg's advantage to 22-2.

SLIPPERY ROCK, Pa. (Nov. 13, 2010) – The C.W. Post football team defeated Slippery Rock, 42-38, and in the process handed head coach Bryan Collins his 100th career win as the Pioneers closed out the season Saturday afternoon on DiSpirito Field.

It was a high-scoring first quarter as both teams combined to score 35 points.

The Pioneers scored in the first drive of the game when Anderwkavich completed a 46-yard pass to a wide open Grayson Laurino at 13:58 in the first quarter.

The Rock answered exactly two minutes later in the next series and scored when Akeem Satterfield hit paydirt on a 30-yard rush at 11:58.

C.W. Post kept the pressure up and scored its second touchdown when freshman running back Anthony Brunetti ran in from The Rock's 2-yard line at 8:40.

Slippery Rock kept pace and Satterfield broke free for a 34-yard touchdown run to tie the score at 14-all with 5:59 to play in the quarter.

The Pioneers had the last say in the quarter and scored their third touchdown when Brunetti pushed his way through from the 1-yard line to give his team a 21-14 lead.

The Rock started the second quarter with 2nd-and-3 from their own 49 and worked their way down to the Pioneers' 39. But the rally for a touchdown ended quickly as quarterback Ryan Sabo's attempt to reach one of his receivers in the endzone was instead picked off by sophomore defensive back Ciwan McCoy for a touchback.

Slippery Rock did eventually score in the quarter in its next drive when Sabo kept the ball and rushed in from the 1-yard line on fourth down with 5:31 to play.

The Pioneers broke the tie when Anderwkavich completed a pass to Laurino who then dodged past Slippery Rock's defense and maneuvered into the endzone with 2:45 remaining in the half.

The Rock attempted to tie it up again with the final seconds ticking down on the clock from the Pioneers' 49 with a fresh set of downs but Sabo's three attempts to connect with a Slippery Rock receiver came up incomplete.

At the half, the Pioneers had recorded 286 total offensive yards on 37 plays and scored four touchdowns. In addition, junior inside linebacker Billy O'Connor had already made 11 tackles.

Slippery Rock finished the half with 246 offensive yards on 40 plays and three scored touchdowns. Satterfield racked up 157 rushing yards on 20 carries with two touchdowns.

The Pioneers added to their lead in the third quarter as Anderwkavich threw his third touchdown completion of the game to senior wide receiver Darnel Williams from the 12-yard line with 6:56 to play.

The Rock trimmed the lead with a touchdown of its own in the third when Satterfield took the handoff from the CWP 8 and sprinted in for his third touchdown of the game. The Pioneers caught a break on the point after kick when junior Alex Mauro jumped up and blocked the kick to prevent it from going through the uprights. C.W. Post led 35-27 at that point.

C.W. Post did, however, fail to convert on a 31-yard field goal attempt when senior Paul Stoltz's kick narrowly missed.

That would come back to haunt the Pioneers as Slippery Rock came back and scored in the next series as Satterfield ran in a 7-yard touchdown and tied the game when Sabo completed a pass to Josh Gardner for a successful conversion with 7:29 to play.

C.W. Post was only able to gain 12 yards in its next drive after starting out at its own 33. Slippery Rock got the ball back at its own 16 after a 39-yard punt from Laurino.

The Rock got help with a 15-yard face mask penalty called against the Pioneers and Satterfield continued to dominate on the ground attack to move the ball down to the CWP 24 with 2:12 to play.

Slippery Rock took the lead when C.J. Bahr kicked a successful 37-yard field goal with 2:08 to play in the game.

Things looked grim for the Pioneers but Anderwkavich stepped up and completed a nine-yard pass to sophomore Sean

Persch to bring the ball to the CWP 29. The next play was a game-changer for the Pioneers as Anderwkavich fired a pass to redshirt freshman Joe Botti around The Rock's 40 and he took it all the way into the endzone for the game-winner.

Slippery Rock got the ball back at its own 43 after kick off but could not find a score as junior Ronnie Modik intercepted the ball at the CWP 45 to close out the game.

Anderwkavich finished the game completing 18 of 25 pass attempts for 314 yards and four touchdown passes and ran for an additional 75.

Laurino caught five of those passes for two touchdowns and 128 receiving yards. Botti caught three passes for 109 yards and a touchdown.

Modik led the game with 20 tackles while O' Connor and Mauro recorded 17 and 16, respectively.

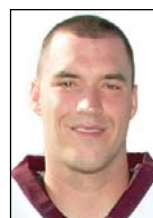

Originating in 1951 to administer and promote men's athletics, the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference has evolved into one of the NCAA's most heralded intercollegiate conferences.

The first major step came in 1977, when based on a growing interest, the league reorganized to provide a structure for its women's programs. Only three years later, lacking a standard competitive division, league voted to reclassify the entire conference to NCAA Division II.

Among its recent enhancements the PSAC has expanded its membership twice during a four-year span. The first occurred during the 2008-09 academic year with the addition of full-time members Gannon University and Mercyhurst College, and associate member Long Island University-C.W. Post. Over the past year, the PSAC's Board of Directors agreed to welcome Seton Hill University as an associate member to begin play in field hockey during the 2011-12 campaign. The membership now consists of 16 full-time institutions and the two associate members.

All of the league's full-time members are located within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, which makes the PSAC the largest one-state conference in the NCAA. The league has also grown to share the distinctions as: The largest conference in Division II, the largest football-playing conference in the

NCAA, and, with 23, the conference that sponsors the most championships at the Division II level.

Highly competitive on a regional and national level, PSAC schools annually combine to send nearly one-third of its teams into NCAA postseason play. Ultimately, the membership's success has yielded 43 NCAA team and 246 individual title winners.

While proud of its athletic accomplishments, the league also has evolved into one of Division II's finest from an academic standpoint. Today, nearly one-third of the PSAC's estimated 6,300 participants are honored each year as "Scholar-Athletes" for maintaining a grade-point average of 3.25 or better - a total that has nearly doubled since PSAC Scholar-Athletes were first recognized in the mid-1990s.

Although all 16 current institutions are members of Division II, seven league schools also compete at the Division I level in select sports. PSAC schools enroll over 127,000 students and claim over 710,000 alumni, including 483,000 who reside in Pennsylvania.

The PSAC is governed by the presidents of the 16 member institutions. It employs a commissioner, an associate and assistant commissioner, and a director of media relations at its headquarters in Lock Haven, Pa.

C.W. POST ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

The C.W. Post Athletic Hall of Fame, which was founded in 2005, honors those who have contributed significantly to C.W. Post's athletic program. Inductees are recognized for their contributions as individual athletes, as members of a team, or for other unique contributions.

Individuals or teams are eligible for nomination if they have been named "All America," have won an NCAA national championship, set a world record, led the nation in a recognized statistical category, succeeded as a professional athlete, participated in the Olympic games or otherwise distinguished themselves and the campus through athletic achievement. Eligibility begins five years after the athlete has graduated. C.W. Post coaches, administrators and staff are also eligible for consideration.

The inductees are chosen by a Selection Committee of at least eight members who include C.W. Post coaches, alumni and Athletic Department staff.

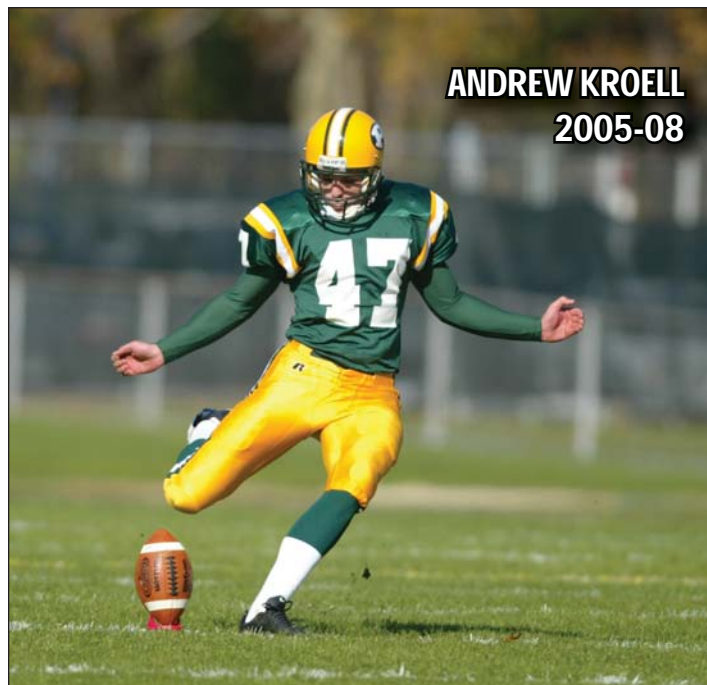

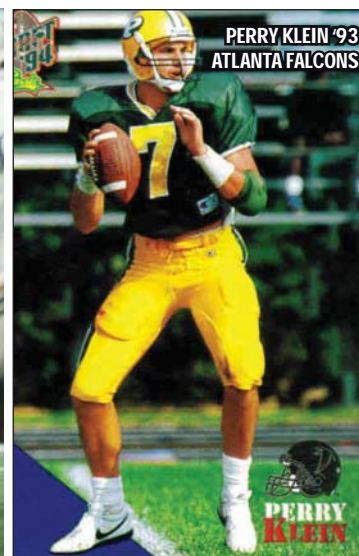

David Steinberg - President, Long Island University

Dr. David J. Steinberg, the ninth president of Long Island University, has served the institution since 1985. The son of the late Rabbi Milton Steinberg of Manhattan's Park Avenue Synagogue, he was born in New York City and was educated at Phillips Academy at Andover, Malvern College in England and Harvard College, from which he graduated magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa. After a Fulbright year at the University of the Philippines and a year at Columbia University on a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship, he returned to Harvard, where he earned an M.A. in East Asian studies in 1963, and a Ph.D. in history in 1964. Dr. Steinberg also has received several honorary degrees.

He began his teaching career in the Department of History at the University of Michigan, where he rose to the rank of full professor. In 1973, he joined the administration of Brandeis University as executive assistant to the president, becoming vice president and university secretary in 1977.

The author of numerous books and articles on Southeast Asia and, in particular, Philippine history, Dr. Steinberg has taught, lectured and written about this important area of the world for a third of a century. His first book, "Philippine Collaboration in World War II," won the University Press Award in 1969. "The Philippines: A Singular and a Plural Place," now in its third edition, was described by U.S. Ambassador to the Philippines Nicholas Platt as "the best single-volume guide to understanding the Philippines, past and present." He also edited and co-authored both editions of "In Search of Southeast Asia," one of the major textbooks on the area. Dr. Steinberg recently collaborated with top scholars from around the world to co-author "The Emergence of Modern Southeast Asia," a new and multifaceted history of this complex region. In addition, he is a co-author of "Religion and Religiosity in the Philippines and Indonesia: Essays on State, Society and Public Creeds," which was published in 2005.

Dr. Steinberg was a member of the international observer team that monitored the Philippine presidential elections when Corazon Aquino defeated Ferdinand Marcos. He has written numerous op-ed pieces and has been a consultant to UN agencies, the United States government, the Ford Foundation and others.

He and his wife, Joan, a chanteuse and real estate executive, reside in McGrath House on the C.W. Post Campus. The couple has two Cavalier King Charles spaniels, whom they sometimes bring to football games on campus. His greatest personal accomplishment: raising his two superb sons, Noah and Jonah. His greatest pleasure: watching his grandchildren grow.



Paul H. Forestell - Provost, C.W. Post

Paul H. Forestell, a professor of psychology and an internationally renowned marine mammal scientist, was appointed provost of the C.W. Post Campus of Long Island University in July 2008. A seasoned administrator, Dr. Forestell served as vice president of the Pacific Whale Foundation in Hawaii, as dean of undergraduate programs at Southampton College of Long Island University, and as associate dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences at C.W. Post.

As provost, Dr. Forestell leads one of the New York metropolitan area's most respected private university campuses, with an enrollment of nearly 5,700 undergraduate, 3,100 graduates and 2,300 continuing education students. He is responsible for campus operations, program development, admissions and recruitment, retention, financial aid, athletics, student affairs, public safety, and buildings and grounds.

His collaborative leadership style has contributed greatly to enhancing the student-centered mission of the University. In 2008, Dr. Forestell established the Division of Student Retention & Academic Support Services at C.W. Post to assist students in achieving academic and career success. A champion of experiential learning, he coordinates study abroad and field research opportunities for students, and teaches classes in whale and dolphin behavior.

Dr. Forestell graduated from the University of New Brunswick in Canada with a bachelor's degree in psychology and philosophy in 1972 and a master's degree in experimental psychology in 1976. He earned a Ph.D. in comparative psychology from the University of Hawaii in 1988. He is the author of several peer-reviewed science articles and four books, including "Humpbacks of Hawai'i: The Long Journey Back."

Bryan Collins enters his sixth year as the Director of Athletics at C.W. Post. Under Collins' leadership, the Pioneers' athletic programs have seen a continual rise in both the regional and national levels of athletic performance and academics.

During Collins' tenure, the Pioneers have achieved both athletic and academic success. Notable achievements include 26 conference titles as well as NCAA championship titles from the 2007 women's lacrosse and 2009 and 2010 men's lacrosse teams.

This past season, the men's and women's cross country, women's swimming, men's lacrosse, softball all participated in NCAA tournaments.

C.W. Post boasts some of top-ranked programs in the country that are frequently ranked in national polls. The Pioneers finished first in the East Coast Conference Commissioner's Cup standings for 2009-10 - the second Cup win (2006-07) during Collins' tenure. Prior to the 2007-08 academic year, the football and field hockey programs gained admission into the esteemed Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference.

Off the field, Collins has included community service as a part of his players' responsibilities. Among the efforts since his arrival have been visitations to the St. Mary's Children's Hospital in Bayside, N.Y., while also volunteering with other charitable organizations such as Habitat for Humanity and the Make-A-Wish Foundation. During the 2008-09 academic year, C.W. Post student-athletes completed over 3,200 hours of service.

Collins is responsible for the creation of a department mission statement based on the foundation of athletic excellence as well as the initiation of the Academic Commitment Excellence (ACE) program, designed to improve attendance and academic achievements in the classroom. In addition, C.W. Post athletic programs are mentored by campus faculty and staff through the Adopt-A-Faculty program.

During 2007-08, Collins established a Student-Athlete Orientation seminar and handbook as well as an annual student-athlete awards banquet to recognize both athletic and academic success. The department also established an Academic Honor Roll to honor student-athletes' who receive a minimum 3.0 grade point average.

Collins has overseen improvements to the athletic facilities on campus, including the installation of FieldTurf on Hickox Field as well as a brand new state-of-the art sound system for the stadium. In addition, all of the outdoor athletic fields have undergone improvements to their playing surface. The Pratt Recreation Center Gymnasium, home to the basketball and volleyball teams, received a new sound system as well as a working press row table for media and game operations staff.

A former student-athlete at St. John's University, Collins played linebacker on the Red Storm's football team and was the recipient of the Dr. Peter Vitulli Award, given to the St. John's student-athlete who demonstrated the most courage, perseverance, dedication and spirit of self-sacrifice in seeking to attain the highest ideals of sportsmanship. Collins received his bachelor's degree in Business Administration in 1987.

Collins and his wife, Patti, reside in Sayville, N.Y. with their son, Tyler (16) and daughter, Megan (11).
